Fremont Dog Park "Leash Cutting" Ceremony



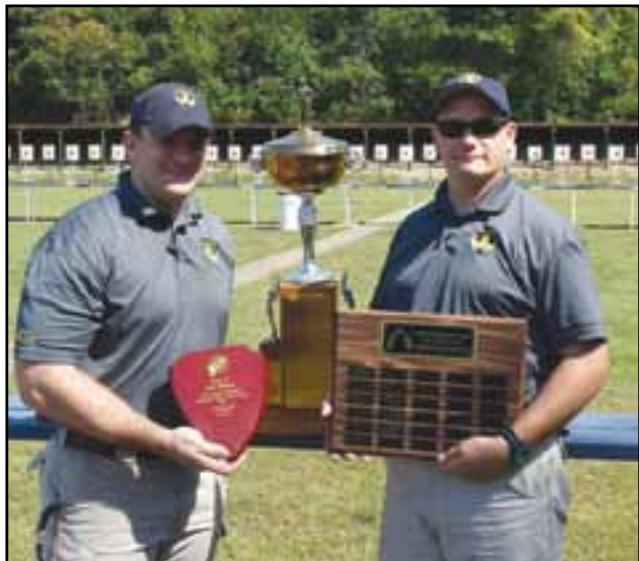
The City of Fremont opened its new Dog Park located on South Lake Drive and Oak Street and had a leash cutting ceremony on November 4, 2015.

FREMONT POLICE DEPARTMENT MICHIGAN PISTOL SHOOT TROPHY

Bullseye shooting doesn't have a lot of value on the street but it does teach the basics of marksmanship and requires practice and precision. While Police officers generally train to shoot "combat style" with two hands on their guns, matches testing such abilities are popular and the State Pistol match in Jackson remains a traditional bullseye competition.

The Fremont Police Department participated in the Michigan Annual Pistol Shoot held on September 10th in Jackson. Our Police Department has established a solid reputation with many awards and accolades in this event, having competed every year for over 44 years. Once again this year Chief Randy Wright and Officer Kevin Kolk took first place in their respective class.

FREMONT FIRE DEPARTMENT CADET PROGRAM

The Fremont Fire Department is currently in the first year of its Cadet Program. Recently, five cadets were inducted into the program. The program is geared towards introducing young men and women to the fire service. Cadets will have the opportunity to learn alongside veteran firefighters during weekly trainings. They will have the opportunity to join the Fremont Fire Department on calls. During a response, the cadets will have limited fire scene responsibility, and will get a firsthand look into what it takes to be an active firefighter.



The Fremont Fire Department currently has five cadets in training. The cadets have gone through one month of training and have progressed well. The Cadet program's ancillary mission is to teach team work, responsibility and service to one's community. The Fire Department is looking forward to this program growing and expanding in the future.

REFUSE CONTAINER CHANGES

During the first two weeks of **January** and **July** each year, the property owner of the collection address may elect to change service from a roll-out cart to mixed-refuse bags or vice-versa by notifying the City Offices. Changes are only allowed during these two-week periods.



REMAIN SECURITY CONSCIOUS

In these economic times, it is important to remain security conscious and to be aware of your surroundings. Keep your homes and garages locked when you are away, and be sure to remove your keys from the ignition, and lock your vehicles whether your car is in your driveway at home, in store parking lots, or at school. Leave only those items in your yard that you can afford to lose, especially overnight. Finally, be respectful of your neighbors, watch out for each other and each other's property. If you have elderly neighbors, please check them occasionally. Working together we will keep the City of Fremont a great place to live, work and play.

Pharmaceutical Drug Collection Drop-Box

The Fremont Police Department has a secure pharmaceutical drug collection drop-box. Community members are welcome to come to the front lobby of the Police Department where unwanted medications may be turned in anonymously.

Medications in standard containers may be deposited in those containers. Loose medication can be put into plastic bags and then deposited. Please ensure any liquid medication is enclosed

in secure containers and placed in a plastic bag before depositing. Syringes are NOT accepted.

Once collected, staff will ensure the medication is disposed of according to State and Federal laws.



City Snow Plowing Policy

The Department of Public Works (DPW) will quickly address specific road hazards like icy intersections or drifted sections of road. Around **1"** accumulation of snow, the salt crew will begin salting operations. The crew will salt the main roads (Main, Stewart & Stone), all intersections, roads with curves and steep slopes. To completely salt every street would be prohibitively expensive and would result in damage that is corrosive to streets, light poles, lawns and trees. It would also greatly increase the salinity of our area's lakes and streams, causing stress on our fish and wildlife populations. Following an accumulation of **2"**, the crews begin plowing operations of the entire street system.

Crews are called in during the early morning hours (approximately 4:00 AM) to begin opening up the major routes for business & school bus usage. We

also have to clear the parking lots downtown before the breakfast crowd hits the restaurants. Typically, DPW uses the sidewalk brush or blower downtown to move the snow onto Main Street where it is plowed toward the center of the street and removed later in the day, most of the time by early afternoon. The



sidewalk plow will begin clearing residential sidewalks once the streets are clear.

When snow continues all day, it is difficult to completely remove the City's snow - especially downtown. Cars parked along the streets and in the downtown parking lots prevent the DPW from making a clean sweep of these areas during the day. It is very important for residents to comply with the "no parking" on City streets between the hours of 2:00 AM and 7:00 AM in order to allow snowplows proper access.

Above all, please stay safe and warm during our winter season.

FREMONT COMMUNITY RECREATION AUTHORITY UPCOMING **MILLAGE PROPOSAL**



The Fremont Community Recreation Authority (FCRA) was originally established by the City of Fremont, Dayton Township, Sherman Township and Sheridan Charter Township in 2013. The purpose has been to coordinate Community Enrichment and Recreational Services and operation of the south half of the former high school facilities at 201 E. Maple Street, as a recreation center for the community.

FCRA received grant funding from the Foundation and participating jurisdictions for the first three years (2013-15) with hopes of becoming self-sufficient in that time period and not depending on the start-up grant funding or establishment of a millage in future years. During the first three years FCRA has gained a membership of over 700 members consisting of all age groups, improved enrichment and recreational programs and expanded use of the facility. New swim education classes, Yoga, Zumba, Pickle Ball and Summer Youth Camp are a few of the new and growing programs.

At the end of this year FCRA will have fallen a little short of self-sufficiency, so a secure funding option must be sought in order to keep the recreation center open. Fremont Public Schools has agreed to extend the building lease to March 31, 2016, allowing FCRA an opportunity to request an operating millage of up to ½ mill for ten years, on the March 8th Presidential Primary Ballot.

The ½ mill will yield approximately \$136,000 annually in tax revenue for FCRA. To the average homeowner in the Fremont community (est. \$100,000 valued home), this would increase property taxes by \$25/year. If successful, FCRA will annually offer a full-month of family membership (\$30) free to all membership households located in the participating jurisdictions as long as the millage is in existence.

The participating jurisdictions (City of Fremont, Dayton Township & Sheridan Charter Township) acknowledging FCRA's need for the operating millage and its importance to the community, have adopted resolutions permitting placement of the millage proposal on their jurisdiction's ballots.

WINTER TAXES

Winter tax bills were mailed on 11/30/15 and are due and payable on or before 2/16/16. On 2/17/16, a one-time 4% penalty is applied, but unpaid tax bills can still be paid with the penalty until 2/29/16.

****Postmarks are not accepted****

On 3/1/16 taxes will be turned over to the Newaygo County Treasurers office, and will incur additional penalties. You should contact the Newaygo County Treasurer's Office @ (689-7230) to confirm the amount due prior to mailing your payment.

PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY ELECTION TO BE HELD MARCH 8, 2016

The Presidential Primary will be conducted on Tuesday, March 8, 2016. Polls are open from 7:00 AM to 8:00 PM. City residents can vote at the Fremont Municipal Building, 101 E. Main Street, Fremont on Election Day or by absentee ballot if they are unable to vote at the precinct on Election Day. If you are not a registered voter, please come in to the City of Fremont Municipal Building. The last date to register for the Presidential Primary is February 8, 2016.



SIDEWALK “SNOW” REMOVAL

If City residents have a sidewalk in their yard, per City Ordinance it is the resident's responsibility to keep the sidewalk clear from snow during winter months.

Also, if residents have a fire hydrant in their yard it is the homeowner's responsibility, as well, to keep the snow cleared from the hydrant.

The City thanks you for your cooperation in keeping sidewalks and fire hydrants clear of snow during the winter months.

HOUSE NUMBERS – Need to be Prominently Displayed

Per City Ordinance, all houses or buildings within the City of Fremont should have their house or building number prominently displayed. Such numbers should be of sufficient size and displayed in such a manner that they are easily read from the street. The Police/Fire Departments recommend a minimum of 4" in size. This is important so in case of emergency the house or building can be found by police officers, fire-fighters or other emergency responders.

Parking-Ban on Streets During Winter

Every Winter season, beginning December 1st, residents are not to park in the streets between the hours of 2 AM and 7 AM. The Public Works Department can not effectively plow the streets with vehicles parked along the curb. Effective April 1st, the winter on-street parking ban will be lifted, and residents may again park overnight on City streets.

Calling Out To All Those Who Would Like To Be An Election Inspector!!!



The City of Fremont is looking for Election Inspectors. The requirements for certification are simple! You would attend a four-hour class at the County Administration offices. Once completed, you will be given an Election Inspector Certificate which would allow you to work any or all elections within a two-year period. (Inspector training is renewed every two-years). As an Election Inspector for the City, you will be paid \$10.00 per hour with breakfast, lunch and dinner provided. The hours required to work are from 6:30 am to 9:00 pm.
