

# Fremont Dog Park Rules

## Hours of Operation:

Dawn to dusk

Seven days a week

Spring, summer and fall

*(closed through winter after first snow)*

The following list of rules is applicable to all users of this City Park:

1. Dog owners and park users are legally and financially responsible for their dogs and their actions, and any resulting injuries or damages.
2. All users must have a valid dog license and tag, and current rabies vaccination.
3. No more than two (2) dogs per park user.
4. Dogs must be under the control of the owner or responsible party at all times. Dogs that cannot be controlled must leave the park immediately with the owner or user.
5. A leash for each dog must be in the possession of the owner or responsible individual and applied immediately in the event a dog becomes aggressive, barks excessively, or is otherwise disruptive or causing damage.
6. Minimum age for users without adult supervision is 12 years of age. Children under 12 may enter the Park under the supervision of an adult.
7. Children should not pet strange dogs without permission of the owner or responsible party.
8. Use the double-gate entries appropriately and ensure only one gate is opened at a time when dogs are entering the off-leash area, and both gates are secure after entry. Dogs should not congregate near the entry gates.
9. Not allowed inside park gates:

Female dogs in heat	Food
Sick or infectious dogs	Toys
Other animals	Glass containers
Smoking	Alcohol
10. Puppies under six (6) months of age are not permitted in the off-leash area. The six-month minimum ensures puppies have required shots, have learned basic obedience, and are appropriately behaved and socialized.
11. As dogs cannot pick up their waste, owners and responsible individuals must do it for them. To control odors and unsightly messes, use waste bags in trash receptacles.
12. Dog owners or park users are responsible for filling holes dug by their dogs, prior to leaving the off-leash area.

*The City of Fremont reserves the right to suspend or revoke park privileges to any person who fails to follow rules or respect the rights of others to enjoy the park or where it is determined a dog or dog owner is dangerous to others or is in violation of any applicable animal ordinances or regulations.*
